Why WEE Camp?



The value of stronger connections between education and industry is continuing to grow. The increasing body of literature indicates that educators become better at their jobs through industry externships.



At WEE Camp, educators cultivate a new appreciation for the skills and proficiencies their students will need for jobs in Central Louisiana. The educational goal is to increase their abilities to connect theory and practice and bring an understanding of workplace practices and policies (problem solving methods, practical applications of theory, leadership concepts) into the classroom, which increases the relevance of student learning.




WEE Camp is often the first time that educators step into the workplace, and view regional jobs through their students' eyes. Until 2015, this opportunity wasn't available to Central Louisiana educators.

As educators begin to reflect on adjusting their classroom practice to incorporate these new concepts, their students will begin to build new proficiencies not only in content, but in skills such as problem solving and collaboration with an emphasis on real world applications.


