

Why SECO?

The Students Exploring Career Opportunities (SECO) Expo has evolved into one of Central Louisiana's premier college/career awareness and exploration events. In collaboration with a diverse set of regional industry partners, we seize students' attention and inspire them to envision an educational and career pathway.

We know that students' beliefs about themselves have significant consequences for high school graduation and future success in life. Research identifies adolescence as a critical developmental window in which youth explore and create their college and career identities. In high school, students may unknowingly disengage from coursework that is key to many of today's most promising careers. This unintentionally, but effectively, closes the doors to potentially fulfilling career pathways.

The Orchard Foundation is determined that every student in Central Louisiana will have the ability and opportunity to apply to and enroll in a post-secondary school (technical, community, four-year) to pursue their career of choice in a regional industry.

The SECO Expo helps us reach this goal by providing a fun, educational space to:

- Promote career awareness through authentic experiences;
- Engage students to explore their different interests, talents, and graduation pathway options;
- Animate subject areas by connecting classroom learning to career settings; and
- Empower students to make informed choices about high school and post-secondary options.

SECO in Brief

The SECO Expo is the only interactive, student-focused event in Louisiana designed to introduce public school students to career possibilities at the 10th grade level. The expo has transitioned from an 8th grade-level event to a 10th grade focused event, a decision based on feedback from education stakeholders that students would benefit most from SECO while in 10th grade.

Available to all 10th graders from Central Louisiana school districts and homeschool associations, SECO provides a dynamic venue for students to experience simulations and demonstrations from industries such as agriculture and forestry, information technology, health care, advanced manufacturing, construction, business management, and more. Far from a typical job or college fair, SECO is designed to provide tangible activities aimed at fostering student engagement and ultimately sparking an interest in future careers.

At SECO, students journey through different career clusters, learning about job prospects from regional industries and educational opportunities from training institutions. Students also complete a financial literacy simulation, during which they learn about the financial aspects of employment. They build imaginary household budgets to see if their ideal job would enable the lifestyle they envision for themselves.


Spotlight: Demonstrations and Simulations

Examples of demonstrations include:

- Simulate transportation, distribution, and logistics with remote control toy trucks.
- Engage in a welding project using virtual reality (VR) technology.
- Operate on a patient in a mock emergency room, dressed in proper clothing.
- Learn about the importance of circuit boards and power line construction and safety.
- Experiment with laboratory chemicals to engage students in chemistry concepts.
- Use hula hoops in a team building activity to set goals, strategize, and communicate in order to complete a task.
- Mimic heavy construction work with a bulldozer simulation.
- Interact with public safety and corrections officers to learn their roles in the community.
- Don impairment goggles, designed to simulate consuming too much alcohol, while attempting to negotiate a course on a tricycle.
